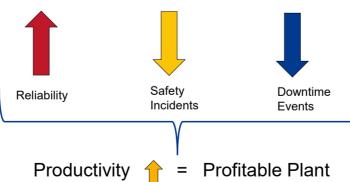

Defining Key Concepts / Terms

- Reliability
 - The ability to consistently perform required functions
 - Creates "Peace of Mind"
- Culture/Organizational Culture
 - Shared values, beliefs, and behaviors
 - How people behave
 - Heartbeat of the organization
- Reliability Culture
 - Everyone is responsible for reliability
 - Everyone tries to eliminate/minimize failures

The Importance of Reliability in Today's **Environment**

- Impact on operational efficiency and costeffectiveness
- Role in safety, compliance, and customer trust
- Competitive advantage in the marketplace
- Costs of failure: 30% downtime increase
- Benefits: 20% cost reduction, innovation





Consequences of Poor Reliability Culture

- Reliability X
- Increased downtime and maintenance costs
 - . Loss of market share
 - . Unable to deliver on time...higher downtime
 - . Lower productivity
- . Safety hazards and regulatory penalties
- . Customer dissatisfaction and revenue loss

Why Reliability Initiatives Fail



- . Lack of leadership commitment
 - . "Must live reliability"
- . Resistance to change
 - . Fear of losing control
 - . What's wrong with what we're doing? "It has been working."
- Ineffective communication
- . Insufficient training and resources
- . Short-term focus

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Leadership Commitment and Vision

- Reliability X
- . Role of senior management in driving reliability culture
 - . Set the tone
 - . Set example by doing...
 - . Rewarding people for doing "proactive actions"
- . Aligning reliability goals with business strategy
- . Creating a clear vision and roadmap

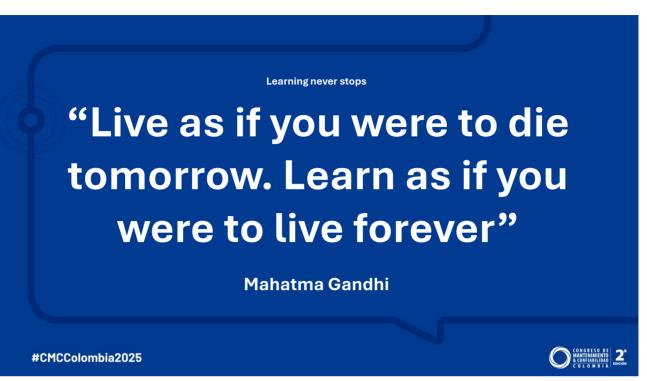
Training and Development

Performance Measurement and Continuous Improvement

Think Balanced Scorecard model: 4 perspectives: People, Process, Customer, and Financial.



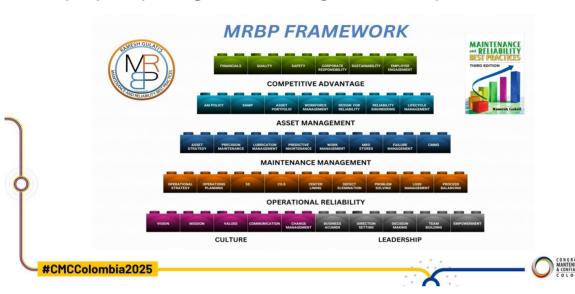




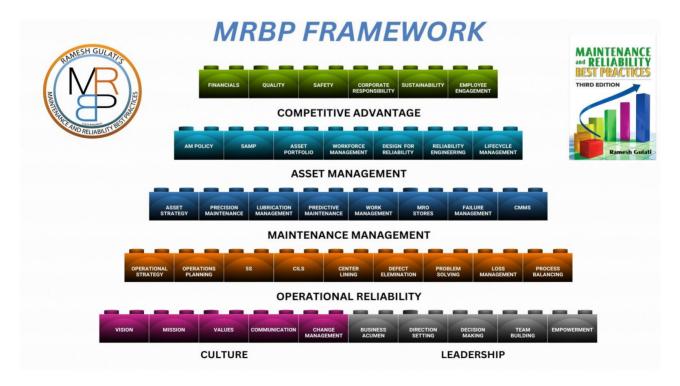

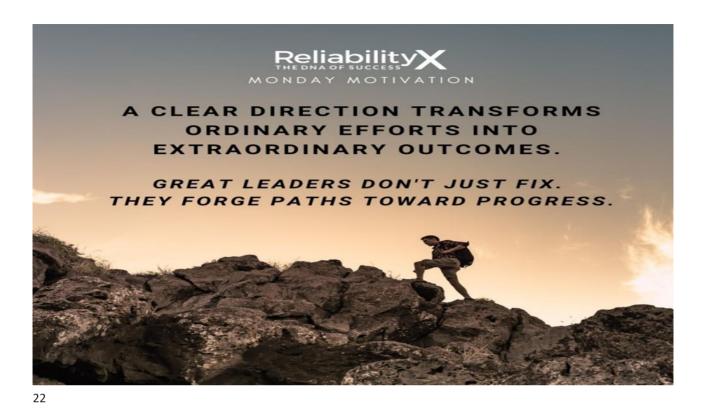


Leadership's Role in Driving Reliability Culture

- . Ensure the workforce is READY for change... improvement
 - . WIIFT (what's in it for them (me))
